SCHOLARSHIP WRITING TIPS

SELECT

Select writing topic A or B, not both.

- Familiarize yourself with Dr. King's life. You can accomplish this through research using books, newspaper articles, the internet, and speaking with teachers or librarians who are well-versed in Dr. King's life.
- Relate the topic to circumstances or situations that affect your own life.
 How does the topic you chose relate to your own life?
- Document all the resources and include them in your bibliography.
 Include Biblical references where applicable.

OUTLINE

Draft an outline to help organize your thoughts and think about the flow of your paper.

DRAFT

First draft

- Have a teacher, parent, or educator review your first draft.
- Have your reviewer pay special attention to the organization of the paper, the supporting details, and elements that don't make sense to them.
- · Update your bibliography.

Edit

 Have a teacher, parent, or classmate review your paper for mechanics (grammar, spelling, punctuation).

Final Draft

- · Read the paper out loud.
- Make sure your voice resonates in the paper, your analysis, and your vision for the future.

FINISH

Do not forget to put your name and birth date on the essay.

Relax! Know that you have done your best on your research paper, and it is ready to submit.
